CIRCULAR

Subject: Establishment of Fever Clinics and movement.
Protocol for suspect cases of COVID-19.

1. The first point of contact for suspected COVID-19 patients in the state now onwards shall be "Fever Clinics" only. In Bangalore until now, 60 Urban Primary Health Centers (**Annexure 1**) and 36 Private hospitals (**Annexure 2**) have been identified as fever clinics. The number of fever clinics in Bangalore will go up in the near future depending on the load of patients. Any citizen with symptoms like fever, cough, sore throat or breathlessness will first approach the fever clinics. As on today, nearly 60 fever clinics are operational.

2. These fever clinics will have a COVID-19 Rapid Response (CRR) team comprising of one doctor, 2 nurses and a health care worker. Fever clinics will function from 9am to 5pm on all days of the week. As per the prescribed protocol, the team will check the symptoms and temperature of the citizens coming to the clinic. Based on the symptoms and temperature, they will triage them into suspected group and safe group. The safe group or those who do not have COVID -19 symptoms will be sent back home with prescription related to their illness. The COVID-19 suspect patient is then sent to the Swab Collection Center (**Annexure 3**) for collecting swab as per protocol in a dedicated vehicle stationed at Fever clinics. The dedicated vehicle will transport the person to the swab testing center and then to the quarantine center until the results of the swab test is received. Flowchart for movement of COVID-19 suspects is detailed in **Annexure 4**.

3. The screening is done free of cost for persons approaching the fever clinic. The testing done at the swab collection centers is free of charge. However, private testing laboratories for COVID-19


- a. Neuberg Anand diagnostic Laboratory, Bowring Hospital road, Shivajinagar, Bengaluru-560001 and
- b. Cancyte Technologies Pvt Ltd, Shankarmatt Premises, Basvanagudi, Bengaluru-560004 identified by ICMR for testing COVID -19

are working as fever clinic cum testing centers. They will do the work of a fever clinic and if a suspected case is there, they will take a sample also. At such private lab-cum-fever clinics, the patient will have to pay the cost of the lab test which the ICMR has fixed. The ceiling / cost fixed by ICMR is as follows :

- a. First step screening assay = Rs 3000/-
 - b. Additional Confirmatory Assay =Rs 1500/-
- Total max. Cost = Rs.4,500/-

The circular of the ICMR in this regard is attached in Annexure 5.

4. Booking of appointments at Fever clinics can be done through a Google spread sheet link <https://forms.gle/54H11fCWst26i2DD9> and later through a software application which will be put in public domain. The software is expected to be ready by 3rd April 2020.
5. The dedicated vehicle will transport the person to the swab testing center and then the quarantine center. Swabs collected by the swab collection centers will be transported as per protocol to the linked government labs for COVID testing. The list of government labs as given in Annexure 3.
6. All suspect cases detected in the fever clinics (till a diagnosis is made), will be kept in a designated facility called a quarantine centre (QC) till such time they are tested negative. Quarantine Centers are Hotels, Hostels and Service apartments. QC will have a team of 2 nurses, 1 doctor and 1 helper per shift. The temperature and symptoms of the suspected cases are monitored as per protocol. In the QC, suspected cases will remain in QC till Test results are received, based on which the suspect is sent to the Isolation center if (s)he has mild symptoms and to the COVID hospital if he has moderate or severe symptoms. If the result is negative (s)he is sent for home quarantine for 14 days and advised to come back to the fever clinic if (s)he has symptoms again or persisting symptoms as per protocol.
7. The preliminary as well as final results of the lab tests will be communicated to the Quarantine facility, District Surveillance Officer and the State Surveillance unit by the Lab.

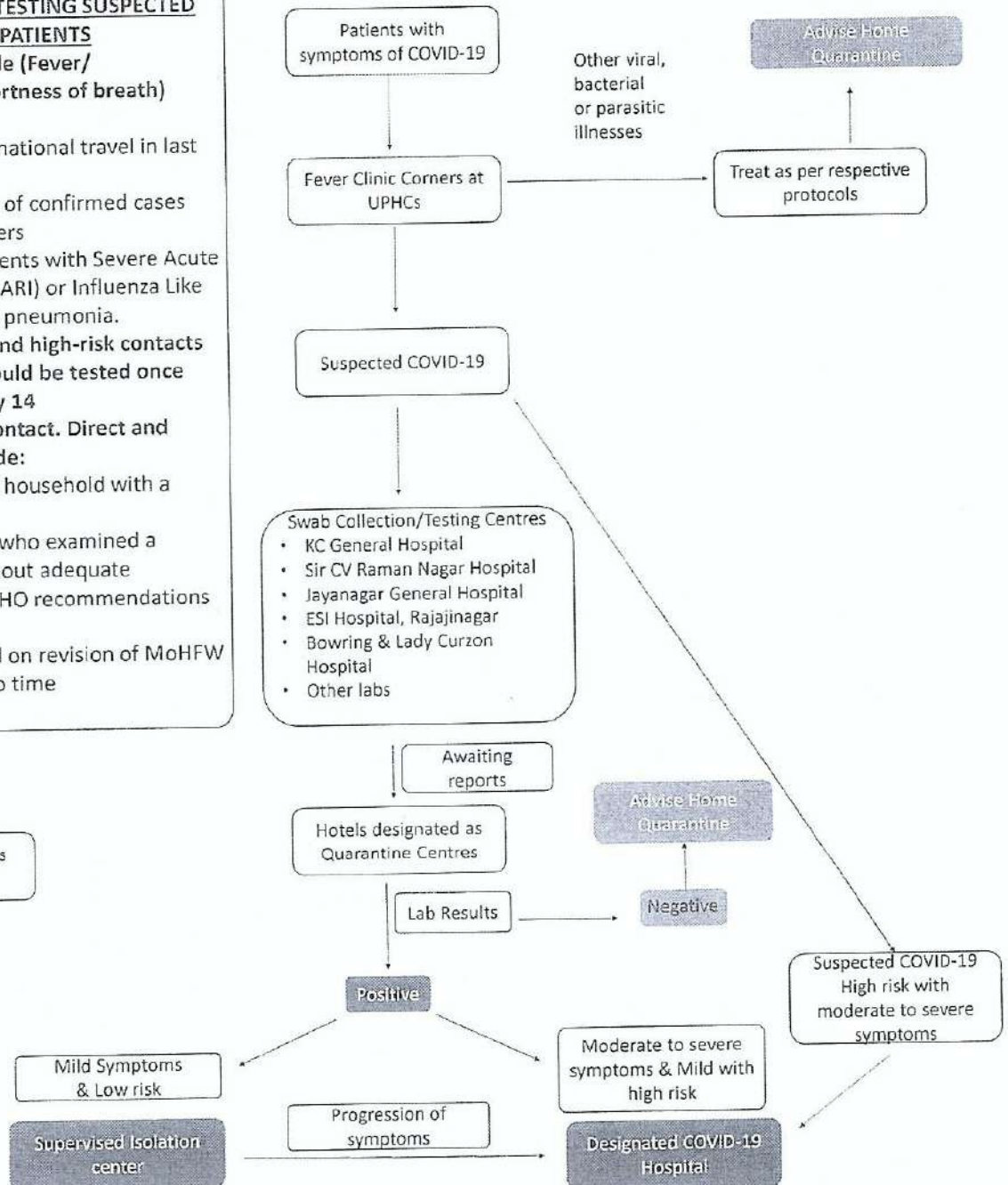
- Have history of international travel in last 14 days
- Had come in contact of confirmed cases
- Are healthcare workers
- Are hospitalized patients with Severe Acute Respiratory Illness (SARI) or Influenza Like Illness (ILI) or severe pneumonia.

Asymptomatic direct and high-risk contacts of confirmed cases should be tested once between day 5 and day 14 of coming in his/her contact. Direct and high-risk contact include:

- Those living in same household with a confirmed case
- Healthcare workers who examined a confirmed case without adequate protection as per WHO recommendations

The guidelines laid down by Indian Council of Medical Research for COVID-19 testing in private laboratories in India (as annexed) is notified vide Clause (i) and (l) of sub-section 2 of Section 10 of DM Act, 2005, under the power delegated vide order F. NO. 40-2/2020-DM1 (A); dated 11th March, 2020 for strict follow up and compliance.

- Government ID to support the current address and contact number of the suspect patient should be collected at the time of sample collection.

Reporting protocols:

- Before any laboratory (private or public) start their activities, they must ensure immediate/real time reporting of the test results along with the contact details to the ICMR HQ database accessible at <https://cvstatus.icmr.org.in>. Login credentials to each lab for uploading the data will be given by ICMR.
- Each laboratory will be given a registration number by ICMR. The registration number given by ICMR should be prominently exhibited in case any advertisement is made and also in the report.
- The access to specified data and analysis to stakeholders like IDSP, MoHFW will be provided through API for timely initiation of contact tracing and appropriate control measures.
- The request should be send at aggarswal.n@icmr.gov.in indicating name, contact details and mobile number of nodal contact for the lab.

Policy for sample storage and destruction:

- All COVID19 positive samples will need to be transported to ICMR-NIV, Pune under suitable biosafety and biosecurity precautions as laid down by ICMR. The negative samples will be destroyed within one week of collection.
- No sample should be shared with any other organisation for any purpose.

Cost of the test:

The National Task Force recommends that the maximum cost for testing sample should not exceed Rs 4,500/-. This may include Rs 1,500 as a screening test for suspect cases, and an additional Rs 3,000/- for confirmation test. However, ICMR encourages free or subsidized testing in this hour of National public health emergency.

These guidelines may be amended from time to time.

Guidelines for COVID-19 testing in private laboratories in India

The test to be conducted by a laboratory which has NABL accreditation for real-time PCR assay for RNA virus.

Whom to test:

Laboratory test should only be offered when prescribed by a qualified physician as per the ICMR guidelines for COVID-19 testing. Since the guidance evolves periodically, the latest revised version should be followed (link below).

(https://icmr.nic.in/sites/default/files/upload_documents/2020-03-20_covid19_test_v3.pdf)/ www.mohfw.gov.in.

Sample collection and Testing guidelines:

- Appropriate biosafety and biosecurity precautions should be ensured while collecting respiratory samples (oropharyngeal and nasal swab) from a suspect patient. Alternatively, a COVID-19 specific separate sample collection site may be created.
- Preferably, home collection of samples may be done by all the private laboratories. This will help avoid the contact of people with the suspect case during local travel to reach the laboratory.
- Only real time PCR based assays are recommended. Conventional PCR, in-house real time PCR and antibody/antigen tests are not recommended for COVID-19 testing.
- Commercial kits for real time PCR based diagnosis of COVID-19 should be US FDA approved or European CE Certified or both for *in vitro* diagnosis of COVID-19 under emergency use, under intimation to DCGI, MoH&FW. Nucleic acid extraction kits and other reagents should be of standard quality.
- All the laboratory staff involved in COVID-19 testing should be appropriately trained in Good Laboratory Practices and performing real-time PCR.
- All the biomedical waste should be disposed off in accordance with National guidelines (https://dhr.gov.in/sites/default/files/Bio-medical_Waste_Management_Rules_2016.pdf).
- The sample should be opened only in Biosafety Cabinet Class II A2. At the time of sample disposal, the Viral Transport Medium (VTM) with swabs should be discarded in a biohazard bag containing 2% Lyzol or 5% freshly prepared hypochlorite solution.

1. Background

The health care personnel working in hospitals are at increased risk of acquiring the COVID-19 disease, if there is a breach in the personal protection while managing patients.

The health-work force is a valuable and scarce resource. Large number of COVID-19 affected health personnel getting isolated for treatment and their close contacts undergoing quarantine affects the health/hospital service delivery.

2. Purpose of the document

The purpose of the document is to provide guidance on preventive measures, isolation and quarantine of health care functionaries.

3. Institutional Mechanism for preventing and responding to Healthcare Associated Infections (HAIs) among HCWs

Hospitals shall activate its Hospital Infection Control Committee (HICC). The HICC in the health facility is responsible for implementing the Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) activities and organizing regular trainings on IPC for HCWs.

A Nodal Officer (Infection Control Officer) shall be identified by each hospital to address all matters related to Healthcare Associated Infections (HAIs). With reference to preventing such infection among healthcare workers, he/she will ensure that:

- i. Healthcare workers in different settings of hospitals shall use PPEs appropriate to their risk profile as detailed in the guidelines issued by this Ministry (available at: <https://www.mohfw.gov.in/pdf/GuidelinesonrationaluseofPersonalProtectiveEquipment.pdf> and <https://www.mohfw.gov.in/pdf/UpdatedAdditionalguidelinesonrationaluseofPersonalProtectiveEquipmentsettingapproachforHealthfunctionariesworkinginnonCOVID19areas.pdf>)
- ii. All healthcare workers have undergone training on Infection Prevention and Control and they are aware of common signs and symptoms, need for self-health monitoring and need for prompt reporting of such symptoms.
- iii. Provisions have been made for regular (thermal) screening of all hospital staff.
- iv. All healthcare workers managing COVID-19 cases are being provided with chemo-prophylaxis under medical supervision.
- v. Provisions have been made for prompt reporting of breach of PPE by the hospital staff and follow up action

4. Action for Healthcare Workers

- i. Ensure that all preventive measures like frequent washing of hands/use of alcohol based hand sanitizer, respiratory etiquettes (using tissue/handkerchief while coughing or sneezing), etc. are followed at all times.
- ii. He/she shall use appropriate PPE at all times while on duty.
- iii. A buddy system* to be followed to ensure that there is no breach in infection prevention control practices.
- iv. Any breach in PPE and exposure is immediately informed to the nodal officer/HoD of the department
- v. HCWs after leaving the patient care units (wards/OPDs/ICUs) at the doctor's duty rooms/hostels/canteen or outside the HCF must follow social distancing and masking to prevent transmission to/acquiring infection from other HCWs who may be positive.
- vi. Pregnant/lactating mothers and immuno-compromised healthcare workers shall inform their medical condition to the hospital authorities for them to get posted only in non-Covid areas

*Buddy system: Under this approach, two or more-person team is formed amongst the deployed hospital staff who share responsibilities for his/her partner's safety and well-being in the context of (i) Appropriately donning and doffing of PPEs, (ii) maintaining hand hygiene and (iii) taking requisite steps on observing breach of PPEs.

5. SOP for health work force deployment during COVID-19

5.1 SOP to be followed in case HCW reports exposure/breach of PPE

All the Healthcare workers must report every exposure to COVID-19 to the concerned nodal officer and HoD of the concerned department immediately

The Nodal officer will get the exact details of exposure to ascertain whether the exposure constitutes a high risk or low risk exposure as described below:

- **High risk exposure:**

- HCW or other person providing care to a COVID-19 case or lab worker handling respiratory specimens from COVID-19 cases without recommended PPE or with possible breach of PPE
- Performed aerosol generating procedures without appropriate PPE.
- HCWs without mask/face-shield/goggles:
 - having face to face contact with COVID-19 case within 1 metre for more than 15 minutes
 - having accidental exposure to body fluids

- **Low risk exposure:**

Contacts who do not meet criteria of high risk exposure

The Nodal Officer/Head of the Department will form a sub-committee to assess the level of exposure and the risk as per assessment format at Annexure I. As per their assessment:

- High risk contacts will be quarantined for 14 days, tested as per ICMR testing protocol, actively monitored for development of symptoms and managed as per laid down protocol.
 - If they test positive but remain asymptomatic they will follow protocol for very mild/mild/pre-symptomatic cases as described in para 5.2.1 (a) below.

- If they test negative and remain asymptomatic, complete 14 day quarantine and return to work.
- Should symptoms develop, follow the guidance para 5.2.
- Low risk contacts shall continue to work. They will self-monitor their health for development of symptoms. In case symptoms develop, the guidance under para 5.2 would be followed.

5.2 SOP to be followed in case HCW reports symptoms suggestive of COVID-19

5.2.1 If any healthcare worker who is manifesting signs and symptoms suggestive of COVID-19, he/she will be isolated immediately and the following procedure will follow:

- In case of mild/very mild/pre-symptomatic case, he/she will have an option of home isolation, subject to the conditions stipulated in the revised guidelines for home isolation of very mild/pre-symptomatic COVID-19 cases (available at: <https://www.mohfw.gov.in/pdf/RevisedguidelinesforHomeIsolationofverymildpresymptomaticCOVID19cases10May2020.pdf>). Such cases would end their home isolation as per timeline provided in the said guidelines.
- In cases where home isolation is not feasible, such mild/very mild/pre-symptomatic cases will be admitted to a COVID Care Center[#].
- Moderate cases that require oxygen therapy shall be managed at a Dedicated COVID Health Center[#].
- Severe cases will be managed in a Dedicated COVID Hospital[#].

For cases admitted COVID Health facilities, their discharge will be governed guidelines available at: <https://www.mohfw.gov.in/pdf/ReviseddischargePolicyforCOVID19.pdf>

5.2.2 Those who test negative, will be managed as in non-COVID area as per their clinical diagnosis. Their resuming work will be based on the clinical diagnosis and the medical certification by the treating doctor.

5.2.3 For HCWs (with low risk exposure), who continue to work and develop symptoms:

- And test positive, further management would be based on their clinical presentation and as described in para 5.2 (1) (a) above
- Those who test negative, will return to work subject to medical certification for ailment

5.2.4 Discharge of COVID-19 positive HCWs will be in accordance with the discharge policy (available at: <https://www.mohfw.gov.in/pdf/ReviseddischargePolicyforCOVID19.pdf>).

5.3 Regular quarantine of healthcare workers after performing duty in COVID-19 areas

Quarantine of healthcare workers, other than what is stipulated above is not warranted.

Sub: Reimbursement of medical claims to Pensioners under CS(MA) Rules 1944 – guidelines issued by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare.

Ministry of Health and Family Welfare vide its OM No. S.14025/23/2013-MS.EHSS dated 29th September 2016 has clarified that CS (MA) Rules 1944 are not applicable to pensioners till date. The Ministry has issued the following guidelines for medical facilities to Central Government pensioners:-

a) **Pensioners residing in CGHS covered areas:**

1) They can get themselves registered in CGHS dispensary after making requisite contribution and can avail both OPD and IPD facilities.

2) Pensioners residing in CGHS areas cannot opt out of CGHS and avail any other medical facility (i.e. Fixed Medical Allowance). Such pensioners, if they do not choose to avail CGHS facility by depositing the required contributions, cannot be granted Fixed Medical allowance in lieu of CGHS.

b) **Pensioners residing in non-CGHS areas:**

1) They can avail Fixed Medical Allowance (FMA) @ Rs. 500/- per month revised to Rs. 1000/- from 01.07.2017.

2) They can also avail benefits of CGHS (OPD and IPD) by registering themselves in the nearest CGHS city after making the required subscription.

3) They also have the option to avail FMA, for OPD treatment and CGHS for IPD treatments after making the required subscriptions as per CGHS guidelines.

2. All retired/ retiring Officers/ Staff of the Defence Accounts Department may please be advised to adhere to the above provisions and subscribe to CGHS facility by depositing the required contributions for availing medical facilities after retirement.

2. It is further informed that the following options to avail medical facilities are available to Central Government pensioners:

a) Pensioners residing in CGHS covered areas:

- 1) They can get themselves registered in CGHS dispensary after making requisite contribution and can avail both OPD and IPD facilities.
- 2) Pensioners residing in CGHS areas cannot opt.out of CGHS and avail any other medical facility (i.e. Fixed Medical Allowance). Such pensioners, if they do not choose to avail CGHS facility by depositing the required contributions, cannot be granted Fixed Medical allowance in lieu of CGHS.


b) Pensioners residing in non -CGHS areas:

- 1) They can avail Fixed Medical Allowance (FMA) @ Rs.500/- per month.
- 2) They can also avail benefits of CGHS (OPD and IPD) by registering themselves in the nearest CGHS city after making the required subscription.



Sub: Post-operative Follow-up treatment from Hospitals empanelled under CGHS in respect of critically ill CGHS beneficiaries-regarding

With reference to the above mentioned subject the undersigned is directed to state that in view of the difficulties being faced by critically ill CGHS beneficiaries in getting post-operative follow-up treatment at CGHS empanelled hospitals, the matter was reviewed and it has now been decided that critically ill CGHS beneficiaries shall be permitted for follow up treatment in CGHS empanelled hospitals as per the details given under:

- i. Permission for post-operative follow-up treatment in respect of the following post – operative conditions requiring frequent Consultations from Specialists at private hospitals empanelled under CGHS, need not be re validated from time to time and follow-up treatment may be under taken at CGHS rates without time limit.
- ii. The consultation /investigations are permitted under these follow-up cases. The conditions covered are:
 - a. Post Cardiac Surgery Cases including Coronary Angioplasty
 - b. Post Organ Transplant Cases (Liver, Kidney, Heart, etc.,)
 - c. Post Neuro Surgery Cases/Post Brain Stroke cases requiring regular follow-up treatment
 - d. End Stage Renal Disease/follow up cases of Liver Failure
 - e. Cancer treatment
 - f. Auto-immune disorders like Rheumatoid Arthritis requiring regular follow-up
 - g. Neurological disorders like Dementia, Alzheimer's disease, Parkinsonism , etc.,

Medicines prescribed are to be procured from CGHS Wellness Centre.

- iii. The beneficiaries shall have to submit a self-attested photo copy of the permission letter to the hospital to enable the hospitals to provide credit facility in respect of pensioners and other categories of CGHS beneficiaries entitled for credit facility. Serving employees (and their dependents) who may not be entitled for cashless facilities shall enclose a self-attested photo copy of permission letter to claim reimbursement from the concerned Ministry /Department.
- iv. Permission in respect of Pensioner CGHS beneficiaries, Ex-MPs (and other categories of CGHS beneficiaries, whose medical expenditure is borne by CGHS) etc., shall be granted by CGHS. Permission in respect of Hon'ble Members of Parliament shall be

granted by Rajya Sabha Secretariat/Lok Sabha Secretariat as the case may and by concerned Ministry /Department in respect of serving beneficiaries and by concerned Autonomous Body / Statutory Body in respect of serving /pensioner beneficiaries.

- v. However, if any non-listed investigations / procedures are advised permission from competent Authority shall be required, except in emergency.

Sub: Consultation from Specialists at CGHS empanelled hospitals in respect of CGHS beneficiaries aged 75 years and above -regarding

With reference to the above mentioned subject the undersigned is directed to state that the matter related to relaxation of consultation norms in respect of elderly CGHS beneficiaries was under consideration of this Ministry and it has now been decided that hereinafter, CGHS beneficiaries aged 75 years and above shall be permitted to seek direct OPD Consultation from Specialists of private hospitals empanelled under CGHS without referral from CGHS Wellness Centre.

2. If any investigations / procedures are advised and are required in emergency, no other authorization is required and the same may be undertaken. However, in non-emergency conditions approval of competent authority is required if any non-listed investigations / procedures are advised. Medicines prescribed are to be procured from CGHS Wellness Centre.

3. Private hospitals empanelled under CGHS shall provide such facilities on cashless basis at CGHS rates to pensioners, ex-MPs, Members of Parliament and such other Categories of CGHS beneficiaries, who are eligible for treatment /investigations on credit basis. More than 75 year old dependents of serving CGHS beneficiaries, who are otherwise not eligible for Cashless treatment shall claim the reimbursement from concerned Ministry /Department. Beneficiaries of Autonomous Bodies /Statutory Bodies covered under CGHS shall claim reimbursement from the respective organization.



ADVISORY TO CGHS BENEFICIARIES

Wellness Centres:

- Avoid unnecessary visits to the Wellness Centre.
- Use online appointment system to avoid overcrowding in the Wellness Centre.
- Avoid non-emergency surgical procedures/interventions like cataract surgery, Knee replacement to avoid overburdening the healthcare systems.
- Practice frequent hand wash with soap and water or with sanitizer when available.
- Practice proper respiratory hygiene. Avoid sneezing/coughing into your hands. Do it only towards the cloth covered part of your elbow or shoulder or into a tissue and dispose the tissue immediately.
- All patients who have travel history to any country/region affected by CoVID 19 or has recent contact with any such people should immediately contact the central helpline number for corona virus - +91-11-23978046 or Karnataka State helpline - 104 or email ncov2019@gov.in
- Avoid taking pain killers other than paracetamol for fever.
- Do not stop any of your regular medicines for Hypertension, Diabetes Mellitus, Heart disease, etc.

Advisory to staff in CGHS Wellness Centres

- All leaves for the staff except on medical grounds, accompanied by medical certificate from Government doctor, shall be cancelled.
- Request for visit abroad shall not be approved. Even in such cases, wherein the leave and other clearances are already issued, fresh approval of SS&DG, CGHS is necessary, if there are any compelling reasons to go abroad
- Medicines for Chronic disease shall be issued for a period of 3 months to ensure that the beneficiaries are not required to visit the Wellness Centre frequently and there is no over-crowding.
- Posters by Govt. supplied from Head Office regarding preventive measures to be prominently displayed.
- Avoid issuing permission for non emergency & planned procedure to prevent overburdening of the healthcare system
- Sensitization of all the staffs should be done regarding precautions, guidelines, proper hand washing techniques, proper method of wearing & discarding mask, etc
- Maintain distance of at least one meter from patients
- Discourage patients from visiting WC for small issues
